Québec City, Monday December 18, 2017 ¤ Spurred by public enthusiasm and critical acclaim, the Musée national des beaux-arts du Québec (MNBAQ) is proud to take stock today of its presentation of the *Mitchell* | *Riopelle. Nothing in Moderation* exhibition before it travels to Toronto (AGO), its other Canadian destination, and Landerneau (Fonds Hélène & Édouard Leclerc pour la Culture) in France.



There are only three weeks left (the exhibition closes on January 7, 2018) to enjoy this unique juxtaposition of the work of two giants of modern art, American painter Joan Mitchell (1925-1992) and Canadian artist Jean-Paul Riopelle (1923-2002), which reveals the story of a unique creative passion. The exhibition is meant to be an ode to creation, a genuine celebration of the strength and magnificence of painting.



A celebration of Mitchell and Riopelle

The 60 major works assembled through the outstanding collaboration of 30 lenders recount their respective artistic careers from the time they met in 1955 until they separated in 1979. The exhibition comprises mainly large-scale paintings and explores how the two artists, who shared their lives for 25 years, developed a studio practice and a distinctive body of art while pursuing a sustained dialogue on abstraction. Their romantic relationship entirely shaped their deeply singular conception of painting and work methods.

The transition from masterpieces to digital experience

This unique circuit hinges on seven inviting themes and allows visitors not only to appreciate the numerous masterpieces of the two pillars of modern art but also concludes with an apotheosis: *Homage to Rosa*

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Luxemburg. Located in the Riopelle Passage by CGI linking the Pierre Lassonde Pavilion to the rest of the museum complex, the monumental triptych that Riopelle produced in a single sweep when Joan Mitchell's death was announced, a long fresco comprising 30 paintings whose signs and codes hint at his meeting with his former companion, here assumes its full majesty and meaning.

In addition, the Hydro-Québec mediation space enables visitors to engage in two digital experiences linked to the exhibition: *Peindre le geste* and *Mitchell* | *Riopelle*. *Dans l'intimité*. Visitors can thus embark on a fascinating voyage to the very heart of the intimacy between two artists at the peak of their powers.

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The exhibition Mitchell | Riopelle. Nothing in Moderation is conceived by the Musée national des beaux-arts du Québec and organized in partnership with the Art Gallery of Ontario and the Fonds Hélène & Édouard Leclerc pour la Culture, with the support of the Joan Mitchell Foundation and of the Succession Jean Paul Riopelle.
